Why study this course?

Assistant Practitioners work as part of the wider health and social care team and have direct contact with patients, service users or clients providing high quality and compassionate care.

Assistant Practitioners work at a level above that of Healthcare Support Workers and have a more in-depth understanding about factors that influence health and ill-health.

Who is the course aimed at?

This course would suit support staff working in the health and social care sector that have the motivation and potential to progress into academic study or within their job roles. Essential to the learner's success is a vocational professional attitude and value base. The potential for managing yourself and other staff within challenging situations is also key to this programme.

Entry requirements

You must be employed in a Health and Social Care or NHS setting.

You must have the full support of your employer/line manager and be able to attend agreed taught sessions.

Level 3 NVQ or equivalent, Level 2 Maths and English.

How long will it last?

Typical duration: 18 months

How will it be delivered?

The knowledge requirements will be delivered 1 day a week.

The competency requirements will largely be delivered within the workplace environment, via directed distance learning, regular assessor one to one tutorials and some evening classes.

20% off-the-job training during contracted hours.

How will it be assessed?

A college workplace assessor will visit you within your workplace to carry out observations on your skills and check that learning is being implemented.

The Standard will be assessed through End Point Assessment once the apprentice, employer and assessor have agreed that the apprentice is EPA Gateway ready.
