Who is the course aimed at?

This apprenticeship is aimed at employees in roles which include: health care assistant/support worker, personal assistant, adult care worker

What will you study

Examples of mandatory units covered include:

- Communication in care settings
- Effective handling of information in care settings
- Duty of care in care settings
- Principles of infection prevention control

Students will also cover optional units in a variety of specialist areas.

Entry requirements

Learners should be at least 16 years old. An initial assessment of English and Maths will be carried out prior to enrolment

How long will it last?

Typical duration: 18 months

How will it be delivered?

You will attend college taught sessions one day a week, the competency requirements will largely be delivered within the workplace environment, via regular assessor visit

How will it be assessed?

A college workplace assessor will visit you within your workplace to carry out observations on your skills and check that learning is being implemented.

The Standard will be assessed through End Point Assessment once the apprentice, employer and assessor have agreed that the apprentice is EPA Gateway ready.

Qualification gained

- Level 2 Diploma in Care
- Care Certificate
- Level 1 and 2 Functional Skills in Maths and English if appropriate

Progression to further study

Successful apprentices can progress, if opportunity allows, onto:

 Level 3 Senior Healthcare Support Worker or a related Level 3 vocational qualification
