Children and Young People's Workforce Early Years Educator Pathway Advanced (Level 3)

The CACHE Level 3 Diploma for the Early Years Workforce (Early Years Educator) prepares learners to become Early Years Educators, enabling them to work with children from birth to 5 years and gain knowledge of children aged 5 to 7 years. Upon achievement of this qualification it is intended that learners will be able to enter the workforce as Early Years Educators.

Why study this course?

- Completing this apprenticeship programme will enable you to continue in the workforce as a qualified Early Years Practitioner and to be counted in the level 3 staff: child ratios in early years settings.
- CACHE is the leading awarding organisation in the care sector. They have surpassed the minimum requirements to develop a qualification which reflects the priorities of practitioners and employers to meet the needs of young children.

Who is the course aimed at?

Job roles include:

- → Day nursery practitioner
- Nursery school practitioner
- Reception class practitioner (in primary schools)
- Pre-school worker

What will you study?

You will explore a variety of topics which are structured around the following themes:

- → Theme 1: Health and well-being
- Theme 2: Legislation, frameworks and professional practice
- Theme 3: Play, development and learning for school readiness

Knowledge and Skills you will develop

Through completing this apprenticeship you will be able to:

- → Provide high quality, care and education for children aged 0-5 years.
- Develop and implement risk assessments and follow legislation relating to the health and safety of children.
- Demonstrate best practice and act as a positive role model for the children.
- Follow the principles for equality, diversity and inclusion.
- -Safeguard and protect children; understand relevant legislation and welfare requirements.
- Promote and support children's healthy lifestyles, physical care routines and emotional well-being.
- Work as part of a team and develop good partnership working with others.
- Observe, plan and assess children's learning and development in relation to the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) curriculum.
- Understand the value of play in the early years and links to theoretical perspectives.
- Understand and support children's transitions; prepare for school readiness.
- Support children with additional needs.
- Take responsibility for own development of skills and knowledge; engage in professional development.

Behaviours you will develop

Working in childcare requires good communication skills, teamwork skills, flexibility, honesty, patience and the ability to improve own learning and performance

Entry requirements

- Learners should be at least 16 years old.
- An initial assessment of English and mathematics will be carried out prior to enrolment, a minimum level 1 functional skills is required.
- Maths, English and ICT Functional Skills Level 2 will be studied as part of the qualification if the apprentice does not already have GCSE grade 4 or above in these subjects.
- → Satisfactory DBS
- → Successful interview

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How long will it last?

→ 18 months / 2yrs

How will it be delivered

- You will attend college taught sessions one evening a week for 12 months
- The competency requirements will largely be delivered in the workplace environment, via regular assessor visits and one to one tutorials.
- You will gain practical experience with each of the following age groups:
 - → 0-1 year 11 months
 - → 2-2 years 11 months
- → 3-5 years
- You will complete a Longitudinal Study of one child across one area of development.

Qualifications gained

- → Cache Level 3 Diploma for the Early Years Workforce (Early Years Educator)
- Level 2 Functional skills in English (if required)
- Level 2 Functional skills in Mathematics (if required)
- Level 2 Functional Skills in ICT (if required)
- → Level 2 Understand Employment Responsibilities and Rights in Health, Social Care or Children and Young People's Settings (E.R.R.)

Progression to further study

- With experience you may wish to progress to Level 4 Advanced Practitioner or Level 5 Leadership and Management.
- Alternatively you can access Higher Education at university to pursue careers such as teaching or children's nursing.
