Senior Health Care Support Advanced (Level 3)

Healthcare support staff can work in a variety of different settings within the NHS and private care facilities. The role of the support staff is to provide assistance to health care professionals in diagnosing treating and caring for patients.

Why study this course

- Do you want to work in a health care support role or already work in a health care support role

What you will study

- The content of the qualification aligns with knowledge and skills required for a senior Healthcare Support Worker an example of the mandatory units covered:
- Promote communication in care settings
- Promote effective handling of information in care settings
- Duty of care in care settings
- The principles of infection prevention control
- Students will also cover optional units in a variety of specialist areas to tailor to the qualification

Knowledge and Skills you will develop

Senior Healthcare Support Workers help registered practitioners deliver healthcare services to people, optional units specific to your role will enable you to do this.

Through completing this apprenticeship you will be able to:

- Provide high quality, compassionate healthcare
- Develop and implement risk assessment plans and carry out a range of clinical and non-clinical

healthcare or therapeutic tasks

- Demonstrate best practice and act as a role model and be able to guide and supervise less experienced staff on the team
- Follow the principles for equality and diversity and inclusion
- Safeguard and protect adults and children; promote the principles of others
- Work as part of a team and learn the behaviours expected from a role model; the principles of training and mentoring
- Understand the meaning of risk assessment and how to recognise hazards
- Ensure that resources (materials and equipment) are used efficiently by ensuring correct use
- Take responsibility for own development of skills and knowledge

Behaviours you will develop

- Customer Focused: Considerate of the needs of users; duty of care
- Collaborative: Able to work as part of a team and with a wide variety of health care professionals
- Effective communicator: Ability to build relationships based on common understanding
- Flexible: Capable of adapting to changing circumstances and expectations
- Honest: Truthful in the dealings with patients and colleagues
- Methodical: Detailed in the way they go about their work

Entry requirements

- Learners should be at least 16 years old
- An initial assessment of maths and English will be carried out prior to enrolment, a minimum level 1 functional skills qualification is required and maths and English will studied as part of the qualification if the apprentice does not already have C grades in both

How long will it last?

18 months - 24 months

How will it be delivered?

- You will attend college taught sessions one day a week
- The competency requirements will largely be delivered within the workplace environment, via regular assessor visits and one to one tutorials

Qualifications gained

- Cache Level 3 Diploma in Healthcare Support, this will include one of the four optional pathways stated above specific to your role
- Level 2 Functional Skills in Mathematics (if required)
- Level 2 Functional Skills in English (if required)

Progression to further study

Completing this apprenticeship programme will enable progression into a wide range of roles within the healthcare sector, to higher apprenticeships or higher education
