





Continuing investment

At Southport College, we pride ourselves on the fact that our students always benefit from bright modern learning environments, fitted with the latest tools and technology for their field. This ensures that when you go on to further study or out into the world of work, you are already experienced in using high quality industry standard equipment.

We have a rolling refurbishment programme, so that all departments are regularly updated.

The most recent to benefit was our Pennington Building, home to our Motor Vehicle **Engineering**; Construction, Surveying and Architecture; Bricklaying and Painting & Decorating departments.

This large scale refit has created fantastic brand new workspaces and ensured students use the latest equipment.

Redevelopments

Amongst other things the redevelopments have meant that Painting and Decorating students now have spacious individual booths to work in, giving them continuous opportunities to practice and perfect their skills in realistic environments and meaning that individual projects can be easily continued over a number of days where necessary. Bricklaying students have a huge new bright and airy workshop to learn their trade, with plenty of space to work on individual projects, watch demonstrations and be inspired by the work of others; and our construction, surveying and architecture department has been completely overhauled.

By Summer 2023, we will also have brand new plastering, carpentry and joinery workshops too, as well as facilities dedicated to teaching the installation of EV charging points.

Students on our Bricklaying, Electrical Installation, Engineering, Painting & Decorating and Vehicle Engineering courses all use purpose built workshops using industry standard tools, equipment and products.






Vehicle Engineering workshops

Engineering facilities for you

As an engineering student you will be based in the Tony Leigh building and will use dedicated classrooms, a Computer Aided Design Suite and Engineering workshops.

The workshops are well-equipped with a range of tools and equipment including Plasma cutter, guillotine, brake press, bench mounted drill, floor mounted pillar drill, pedestal grinder, M.I.G. and T.I.G. welding sets. The mechanical workshop contains up to date, brand new machines, lathes, millers and computerised controlled (CNC) machines.

In addition, you will have access to cross-college facilities including the Library and Study Centres.

Continual investment

Our Engineering department has benefited from a recent £1.3 million refurbishment project providing students with a new, modern e-learning classroom and an extended and refurbished workshop housing £150,000 of new equipment.

All of our tutors are industry experienced engineers who pass on their wealth of skills and knowledge to students and high spec machines, equipment and resources are used in the workshops to help students prepare for work in the industry.


Electrical workshops

#Free Travel Passes

Southport College is in the heart of the town centre and is very easily accessible, by bus, train, bike or on foot.

Free Travel Passes*

All Southport College students who are aged 16-18 and live more than 3 miles away from College, are eligible for a free travel pass, you just need to apply.

Our free travel passes are valid 7 days a week, so not only will you be able to use it to get to and from college whenever you need to, you can also use it in the evenings and at weekends to visit friends or go to work too. How good is that!

Students who live 1-2.9 miles away may still be eligible, depending on their circumstances, so please do contact us for more information.

Please note that the college may also allocate a trio pass where daily use of multiple transport providers is unavoidable.

By car

Southport is accessed via the A565 from both the north (Preston) and the south (Liverpool) and by the A570 (Ormskirk and the M58).

The College is situated off Lord Street, on Mornington Road. Visitors attending our open evenings throughout the year are able to access free on-site parking. For Satnav: enter our postcode PR9 OTT.

By train

A five-minute walk from the College, Southport station is accessible from all stations towards Liverpool and Hunts Cross through Merseyrail's Northern Line service. There are also Northern Rail trains linking the College to Burscough, Appley Bridge, Wigan and other stations towards Manchester.



After we receive your application, we will invite you to a course discussion to check if the course is right for you. It's also your chance to ask about things such as finance or learning support.

#Step 4

Formal offer

Following a positive course discussion you will be offered a place to become a Southport College student.

#Step 5

Enrolment

During the summer break all applicants will be sent a link to our application portal. This enables you to check all your details are correct and you've given us all the information we need.

You will then be sent your individual enrolment date and time. This will usually be for either the day of or the day following GCSE results and takes place on campus.

You will need to bring proof of your results, then you complete your enrolment and collect your college ID badge, all ready for term to start.

It's quick and simple and parents or guardians are welcome too.

The Student Information Centre is a one-stop shop for any information, advice and guidance you may need before and during your time at College. We aim to ensure that you have the support you need to enable you to make the most of your time at College.

We can help you with:

- # Information, advice and guidance about courses
- # Impartial careers guidance and support
- # University information and student loans
- # Financial assistance such as travel passes, help with kits, uniforms and childcare
- # Access to the Safeguarding and Welfare Team
- # Counselling support
- *Students aged 16-18 who live more than 3 miles away from the College on a full time course will be eligible for travel passes (or funds where necessary). Students who live 1 to 2.9 miles away from the College and are 16-18 are means tested before passes are issued. Students aged 19 and over will be means tested to assess for eligibility before passes or funds are issued. Other terms and conditions apply. Additional information is available on the application form or through contacting the Student Information Centre.

Throughout your time with us, you will have access to a wide range of information, advice and guidance.

Safegarding & Welfare Support

We recognise our duty of care to students and the wellbeing of our students is paramount at all times. Safeguarding Officers offer support to all learners who may be facing adversity, including those who are Looked After, Young Carers, Teenage Parents or who are under the supervision of the Youth Offending Team.

We also work with learners who are in financial crisis and are able to offer financial support via charitable bursaries (subject to eligibility), housing support and access to local foodbanks.

Financial Support

16-19 bursaries

This is a fund intended to assist those students who face the greatest barriers to being in education, e.g. care leavers, young people in care and young people in receipt of Income Support. Students who do not qualify for the full £1,200 may still qualify for help from the Bursary Fund with course-related costs, e.g. kit, equipment, uniforms, books. Please ask at your course discussion.

Discretionary bursaries

Students who do not meet the criteria for the above, but are facing financial hardship, can apply for help towards uniforms, certain trips, UCAS fees, DBS and other course related costs. Students must have a household income of less than £35,000 as assessed by HMRC, or the family must be in receipt of a means-tested benefit.

Travel passes

The College offers students* who live over 1 mile away from College and study a full-time Further Education course the opportunity to apply for a free travel pass or funds. See page 32.

Care to Learn (Childcare support)

Care to Learn provides financial support for young parents. The scheme can pay up to £160 a week towards childcare. You must be aged under 20 on the date you start your course.

Feel safe

Southport College is committed to creating an environment that is safe and welcoming to all students. As a College, our community includes young people aged 14 to 18 and vulnerable adults.

We ask that you wear your student ID badge at all times and our security staff monitor this throughout the day. For this reason and as part of our commitment to safeguard our students and provide a secure place to learn; we ask all potential students to declare if they have a criminal conviction, any pending court cases or if they have been charged with any criminal offence either at application stage or during their course.

You will be asked to complete a declaration at the point of enrolment. If you do have convictions, you won't be automatically excluded from enrolling on a College course; each case will be considered individually.

Learning Support

Support for identified students

Identified students who disclose a support need are individually interviewed to assess their needs and the level/type of support or tutoring required. We also regularly review all students receiving support to ensure the most appropriate support is in place.

We are proud to have an outstanding student support structure that is tailored to your individual needs.



More and more businesses are insisting their employees have GCSEs in both English and maths at grade four or above and it is an essential part of university entry criteria too.

If you don't already have a grade four in English and maths when you arrive at Southport College, we will create a personalised study programme for you that will fit alongside the course you have chosen and will help you to achieve these vital qualifications.

All you need to achieve and succeed is commitment and engagement.

Make English work for you

English at the College is very enjoyable and achieving a qualification in it gives you the best opportunity for a fantastic career.

Our caring and professional teachers are experts at supporting students to get the results they need.

Alongside our interactive, student-focused lessons we offer additional support sessions and a range of additional Co-curricular opportunities such as Creative Writing competitions, a reading group and an Amnesty International group for students who want to make a difference.

What you will study

Your personalised study programme may include: GCSE English Language

The GCSE English language course offers modules in Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing and Writers' Viewpoints and Perspectives. The course will help you gain lots of transferable skills that will prove invaluable in the future.

In addition, you are offered the opportunity to practise your presentation and listening skills in the Spoken Language endorsement. As effective communication is so important in a range of careers, this is a useful skill to develop.

Functional Skills English Entry Level/Level 1

This is a stepping stone to Level 2 Functional Skills or GCSE and provides the building blocks of English such as sentence structure, punctuation, grammar and comprehension.

Level 2

An alternative to GCSE if future plans do not require this qualification.

It refreshes topics such as sentence structure, punctuation and grammar but also provides knowledge of how to analyse and interpret meaning in text. You learn skills such as letter, report and article writing, essential for the workplace.

Make maths work for you

Maths lessons at Southport College are highly interesting and engaging as teachers use a variety of resources including many new interactive platforms to teach with.

Our dedicated maths teachers are experts both in the subject and at supporting students, delivering exciting lessons as well as additional support sessions where appropriate. They are here to fully prepare you for any exams and teach techniques in the classroom that reflect the exam papers.

What you will study

Your personalised study programme may include: GCSE Maths

Requested by most employers and required for entry into university, GCSE Maths is a fantastic qualification to help get you onto the career path you want. We teach the latest syllabus which focuses more on mathematical thinking and problem solving. Some questions in exams are contextually set in the real world so we have an emphasis on using real life problems in the classroom and applying maths techniques to solve them.

Functional Skills Maths Entry Level/Level 1

If you haven't achieved a GCSE maths grade, we can offer an Entry Level or Level 1 Functional Skills course to prepare you for maths GCSE.



#Find your vocation

Preparing you for work

Our vocational courses mix theory and practical experience designed to prepare you for work.

Most of our courses offer work experience or a work placement as part of the course and you will also benefit from the industry knowledge of quest speakers and local employers.

Some of our students work on live briefs (projects set up by local employers) that give them the experience of working in that job role.

Go to University

Vocational qualifications can get you in to University, T Levels and BTEC Level 3 Extended Diplomas being equivalent to three A-Levels. University websites will tell you what grades you need to do a particular degree course.

Become a specialist

Unlike A-Levels where you would study a number of subjects, vocational qualifications are designed to give you an in-depth knowledge of one subject area.

This will be an advantage when you start your career or head to University as you will already have a detailed understanding of your chosen specialist area. The courses are industry-led which means what you are learning is what you would need to know to work in that sector.

Earn while you learn

If you are keen to start your career, Apprenticeships are offered from Level 2 all the way up to degree level.

We have strong links with employers giving you great opportunities to work for local companies. Apprenticeships are a great way to get experience and achieve a qualification whilst getting paid.

A professional qualification

Many of our courses are industry recognised qualifications which means you will be ready to start your career once you have completed the course.

The College has realistic working environments including salons, treatment rooms, a restaurant, kitchens, studios and workshops.

All of these learning areas are designed to give you the experience of working in your chosen career and combined with your qualification, set you up for the next step towards your dream job.

#Get to where you want to be

Connect (Entry Level)

Our Connect course is for learners who are working towards Entry Level 2.

The course is tailored to a student's individual needs and focuses on the transition to College from school as well as preparation for their next step.

It consists of two 1-year courses dependent on the ability/achievements of students. The course is designed to give students the confidence and skills to progress on to one of our vocational courses, work experience through a supported internship or move towards independent living.

Aspire (Entry Level 3)

This is a one-year course designed to help students to prepare for their next step on the career ladder.

Students learn employability and independent living skills and during the course try out tasters in a number of different subjects around College to help them to choose what they would like to progress to next.

Ambition (Level 1 Pathways)

Our Level 1 pathways allow learners to explore and gain skills in four exciting vocational areas whilst at the same time developing maths, English and employability skills.

The course takes a year to complete and there are 4 pathways to choose from. They are a great introduction to the subjects and are designed to help you choose what you might like to progress to at Level 2, or alternatively where you might like to work or start an apprenticeship.

Level 1

Available in a wide range of subjects.

These one year courses are an introduction to your chosen subject. When you have finished the course you will be ready for Level 2, full-time work or an Apprenticeship. For entry requirements, please see the individual course listings.

Level 2

One-year courses available in a wide range of subjects.

You will study your chosen subject in detail as well as put the theory into practice. After you have completed the course you will have the option of progressing to Level 3, looking for full-time work or perhaps starting an Apprenticeship.

Entry requirements for this level vary from course to course; please see the individual course listings.

Level 3

These vocational qualifications take one or two years to complete depending on your chosen subject.

Once you have completed your course you can progress into employment or onto an Advanced or Higher Apprenticeship.

Some Level 3 courses may also give you enough UCAS points to progress to Higher Education. To study a skills-based course at Level 3 you will need a Level 2 qualification in a vocationally related area.

T Levels

T Levels are new Level 3 qualifications that are being introduced in various subject areas.

They are equivalent to 3 A-Levels and focus on technical skills that can help students into skilled employment, university or apprenticeships. We are proud to have been selected to offer T Levels in 7 areas for 2023. Please see page 56.

Level 3 Extended Diploma

Along with T Levels these are the vocational equivalent of A-Levels.


They take two years to complete, give you the UCAS points to apply to University and can be worth the equivalent of three A*grades at A-Level. They also give you the experience that businesses want so you can apply for a job or an Apprenticeship. To study for an Extended Diploma you will need a minimum of 5 GCSEs at grade 9-4 (A*-C) including Maths and/or English at grade 4 or equivalent.

Higher Education

We also offer a range of higher education courses for students who have completed a Level 3 qualification.

#Introducing T Levels

So what are T Levels?

The 'T' stands for "Technical" and they are Level 3 qualifications that will give 16 to 19 year olds a high quality technical alternative to A-levels.

One T Level is equivalent to 3 A-levels and will attract the same number of UCAS points (depending on the grades achieved), so students can use them to progress to University.

T Levels are a full time programme and are taught in College. However they also include a valuable industry placement for a minimum of 315 hours (approximately 45 days) which is delivered in the workplace. This placement is unpaid and you remain a college student, rather than an employee of the company.

We have a fantastic range of T Levels for 2023. T Levels have been recently introduced and are two-year technical programmes, designed in collaboration with employers, to give young people the skills that industries need.

What do the courses cover?

The exciting new T Level programmes will provide our students with:

- # The broad knowledge, skills and behaviours necessary for employment in an industry related to their field of study
- # The opportunity to develop specialist technical skills needed for a related occupation
- # Relevant maths, English and digital skills.

Successfully completing a T Level will give you a progression pathway to skilled employment, higher or degree-level apprenticeships and University.

Are they all the same level?

All our T Levels are the equivalent of studying three A Levels, allowing you to achieve a maximum of 168 UCAS points.

If you don't quite meet the entry requirements to start a T Level programme, we offer a range of options to help you

This can involve completing a Level 2 qualification alongside any maths or English qualification you need and then start.

For Design, Surveying and Planning students not ready to go directly onto a level three T Level qualification, we offer a T Level Transition Programme. This is a one year course and successful completion will give you the skills needed to move on to the full T Level the following year. See page 86.

#Apprenticeships

What is an Apprenticeship?

An Apprenticeship is a job with training and an alternative route into skilled employment.

They are designed in partnership with employers to ensure employees gain the skill they need to do their job well.

Apprenticeships are offered in over 1500 occupations and available to people over the age of 16. How does an Apprenticeship work? Apprentices work alongside experienced staff to gain knowledge, experience and ultimately a qualification in the area they wish to pursue a career in. Apprentices can be paid the National Minimum Apprenticeship Wage or the National Minimum Wage according to age but some apprentices earn significantly more.

As part of the structured programme, apprentices work towards qualifications by studying technical skills and carrying out practical assessments. Depending on your employer and their type of business you may receive training on a day-release basis, where you would attend college one day a week. However for some Apprenticeships, all training is delivered in the work place

Can I do an Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeships can be challenging as you will be working for an employer and training for your job role at the same time. Our checklist below will tell you if an Apprenticeship could be the route for you:

- # You must be over the age of 16 and have completed your GCSEs
- # You must find a job in your chosen sector and have an interest in progressing in that job role
- # You must have a minimum grade 4 in GCSE English and maths or a willingness to improve your English and maths skills
- # Your employer must be willing to offer you an Apprenticeship
- # You will need a good work ethic, excellent timekeeping and a professional approach

How do I get an Apprenticeship?

Look for vacancies

Register with the National Apprenticeships Services www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship and view their current vacancies. If you are interested in any of the advertised vacancies you can apply through their website. You can also view the Apprenticeship vacancies on the Southport College website. These are the vacancies where Southport College will deliver the training for those employers.

Approach employers

You can find your own Apprenticeship by approaching businesses with your CV and a Covering Letter.

Remember to choose businesses that you are interested in working for.



#Bricklaying
